Introduction to Nursing (HLT33115 – Health Services Assistance)

The Introduction to Nursing course offers a range of opportunities for students to learn and experience the role Nurses and other health professionals perform within the health services system. It provides practical, theoretical and workplace experiences which allow for students to explore 'what is health, nursing and working within the health services?'

Course Objective: The aim of this course is for students to obtain work or proceed to future studies within health services.

The course maps units from **HLT33115- Certificate III in Health Services Assistance.** Students complete 4 thematic topics through three different pathways, in which they can receive statements of attainment for any units completed or the full qualification over two years. Working in the simulated hospital, along with work placements within the relevant health field it sets students up for future employment or studies within the nursing or the broader health services.




Authenticity and Academic Integrity

Work Preparation

Introduction to Nursing Students will be offered different work placements and work preparation as part of their chosen pathway option. Work preparation is **not incorporated in Pathway 1 units** though may be able to apply, **subject to availability**, with preference going to students in the Pathway 3 and 2.

Purpose: The purpose of the work placements is to provide students participating in the Hobart College Introduction to Nursing course an introductory opportunity to work in a health services facility to see the role of a Registered Nurse, Enrolled Nurse and/or Carer.

Approach: Students will be expected to work within the scope of practice of a Carer and that designated by the facility that they are working in.

There a designated two main placements with key goals.

Placement

1 week or twice a week for 3 weeks within June, July, August or September – placement times a designated by the facility.

Goal: For students to understand the scope of practice for an RN, EN and Carer.

Some key activities include:

- Interacting and communicating with patients/residents/clients
- Exploring health and wellbeing concepts.
- Participating in diversional activities or other wellbeing activities.
- Observe simple nursing observations (blood-pressure, pulse, temperature, respiratory rate) in accordance with the placement.

Expectations of students prior to placement:

Students are required to apply in Term 1 and sit an interview processes. To be successful students must also have

- Completed WHS forum and units including Manual Handling
- Completed a Police Check.
- Completed all of Topic 1.
- Completed first aid certificate.

Expectations of students on placement and after:

- Attend each shift 15 minutes early.
- Participate in all activities assigned by their supervisor
- Complete appropriate reflections.
